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❖ Stanislaus Asociación de Investigación Latina (SAIL) was funded by the Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education (FIPSE) to establish a Doctoral culture focused on Hispanic education issues.





- ♣ The grant targets current Ed. D. candidates, MA students, and the administrators and teachers at Bilingual/Dual Language Schools currently seeking educational preparation to provide effective leadership and assessment in dual language education.
- \* SAIL supports small learning communities of participants, Faculty Mentors, Community Mentors, and community educational leaders.



- \* Activities include mentorships, research experiences, and face to face and online learning communities to create a pathway for professional growth, high academic rigor, and career advancement.
- \* Establishing a Hispanic Education Research Symposium to expose our graduate students to national scholars conducting cutting edge research in Hispanic Education and to motivate our students to pursue similar research projects.

- ♦ The SAIL program model is based on the direct connection between theory and practice
- ♦ to address the curricular issues in dual language schools
- to address the effective preparation of educational leadership in dual language schools.
- ♦ Dual language school educators participating in the SAIL learning communities will articulate the problems and issues faced daily in dual language education.



- ♦ These learning communities will define the problems into researchable topics for masters theses and doctoral dissertations
- ♦ These masters theses and doctoral dissertations will have a direct impact on the instructional programs of the dual language schools.

# Three broad goals have been established for the project:

- **♦** 1. To establish a learning community that will provide an academic and social support structure for students.
- ♣ To increase student engagement in their academic program.
- ♣ To increase student motivation to complete the program and continue in the profession.
- ♣ To create a bridge between the academic and professional culture.
- ♦ To increase student retention and graduation rates.



- ♦ 2. To develop research capacities within graduate students.
- ♣ To improve the ability of students to establish research questions.
- ♣ To improve the ability of students to gather both qualitative and quantitative data.
- → To improve the data analysis skills of students.
- ♣ To improve the written communication and formal presentation skills of students.



- **♦** 3. To establish a collaborative to study key issues in the education of Hispanic students.
- ♣ To develop a mentoring relationship between graduate students, professors, practitioners and educational leaders from the surrounding community.
- ♣ To conduct research on dual-language schools in the local area.
- ♣ To conduct research on effective dual language instruction.

# Project Components

- ♦ Community Mentors will be paid a stipend for their effort and time in providing support, guidance, and assistance to student participants.
- ♦ Subscription for an annual license for EthnoNotes/Dedoose is budgeted for 3 faculty and 30 students.
- \* Research Symposia presentations by experts in the field. Two symposia per year.
- ♦ One Conference attendance for research presentation and project dissemination will be completed by each Project Scholar as well as Community Mentors/Consultants and Faculty Mentors.



- ♦ We will be conducting a needs assessment to gather qualitative and quantitative data on program development and assessment specific to Bilingual/Dual Language Schools.
- ♦ This grant has the potential to significantly increase the number of Hispanic and other underserved and underrepresented students successfully pursuing graduate education and assuming educational leadership roles.
- ♦ The grant will have a significant impact on dual language education and Hispanic education.
