

Why an Application Party?

- Large number of seniors who had not completed applications before November 15.
 - Students had not composed essay
 - Students had not selected schools to apply to
- Many students who started applications suddenly stopped.
 - Major time-management issues
 - No ownership of application process (i.e., parents completing applications on their behalf)



Party Details

- Admissions Counselors in the Central Virginia were contacted via e-mail and letter
- Admissions Counselors were asked to help students complete college applications
 - Applications were not specific to their schools
- Students were notified of the event through emails, announcements, flyers, and "Connect-Ed" messages.

Party Details

- Upon their entrance, students signed an agreement to be full participants.
- Students grouped into three clusters:
 - Have not completed essay, have not completed application
 - Completed essay, have not completed application
 - Completed essay, completed application, ready for submission.




Party Details

- Students were given breaks every thirty minutes.
- Also at entry, student given "BINGO" card.
 - Every fifteen minutes BINGO cards were checked
 - The first student to get BINGO was given a prize.
- Snacks were provided during each break period
